

Key Worker Childcare

### April 2020

As a number of staff and families had been advised to self-isolate by the PHA and in line with government legislation and to limit the spread of infection Omagh County PS is closed this week.

However, we do realise that it is vitally important our essential key workers are able to attend work.

We have been working with the Education Authority to ensure that when families need childcare we are able to facilitate this or provide alternative arrangements.

Where possible children will be looked after on site in Omagh County PS, where this is not viable due to reduced availability of teaching and non-teaching staff or cleaning staff, children will attend another local school where they will be supervised by a member of Omagh County PS teaching or non-teaching staff. Where Omagh County PS staff are unavailable they will be supervised by staff from other local schools or EA staff.

It is imperative that this is not abused as it puts everyone's life at risk and should only be used as the absolute last resort. Parents are reminded-

- To ensure strict health and hygiene measures and social distancing, places will be limited
- Parents must be key workers- priority will be given to NHS staff and critical key workers
- <u>Parents must be out at work while their child(ren) is in childcare</u> a key worker working from home is not viable for a place.
- Where there are siblings in a family they should be kept together to limit spread of infection- an older sibling or family member may be able to look after them or where there are younger children families may be able to avail of the Home Childcare Scheme.

I know some of our NHS and front line staff have been in touch and do not know if or when they might need support - we are in a very fluid and unprecedented time and we appreciate this and will work with you and support as much as we can. If you need childcare-

So many of you who I been talking to have so rightly said you want your children home safe and sound with you and that school will be your very last resort - we know and appreciate that, but likewise we appreciate the essential work you as essential key workers are undertaking and we will support you as much as we can.

After taking advice the following arrangements <u>MUST</u> be followed to try and ensure that Omagh County Primary School can remain open for Key workers families and to support the children;

\*\*I <u>(please insert you name)</u> am in agreement with the following arrangements

Failure to insert your name means your application will be void.

- All transport to and from school is the responsibility of the parent/carer.
- Only pupils that have had confirmation of attendance can attend.
- If your child requires Medication this will be transported with the child on a daily basis.
- Arrive at the front entrance/drop off area between 9.00 and 9.05am (no earlier). On arrival please wait in your car outside the entrance hall until a staff member indicates that you can come forward. (or??)
- Each child will have their temperature taken and hands sanitised before entering the building.
- If your child has a temperature you must take your child home immediately and not return for two weeks. We insist that you follow Public Health advice.
- If you or a member of your family/household has the symptoms the child must not attend.
- Parents and carers must not enter the building at any time.

- All children must bring their home school learning packs that they can work independently on. Activities provided in school will be of a child-care and supervision nature.
- Each child must bring their own stationary- including colouring pencils etc
- Each child must bring in their own water bottle, snacks and packed lunch in a sealed clearly labelled lunch box.
- Each child needs to wear a t-shirt or short sleeved shirt to allow for regular handwashing.
- If your child has long hair please ensure it is tied back.
- On returning from the School and each morning please ensure that you child showers and changes their clothing, washing whatever they have worn.
- Parents and carers must arrive at 3.00pm to collect their child. They must wait in the car or on the steps and a staff member will escort the child to the front door.
- Please respect social distancing for our staff and parents/carers you meet in the car park.
- This provision will be open on a day to day assessment, note that it may be closed on a moment's notice if we have no staff to safely operate. The staff are committed to stay open as long as we can but we also must follow the Public Health advice.

# These arrangements may be reviewed at any time following new advice or issues that arise.
